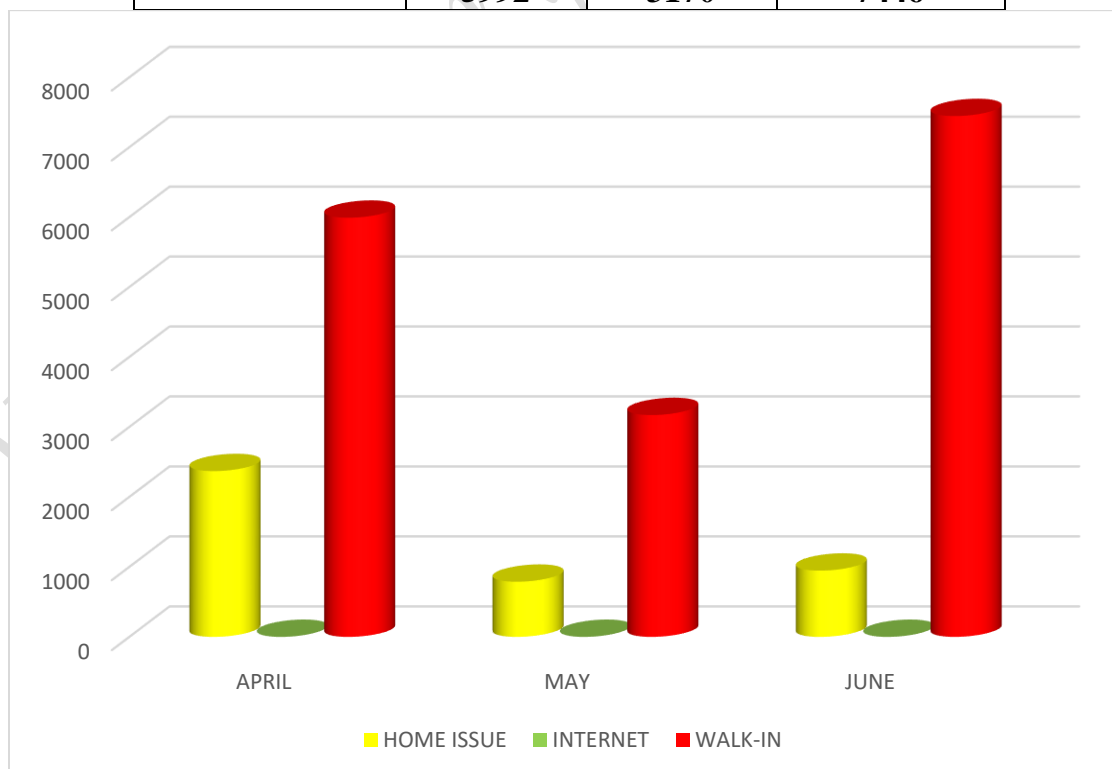

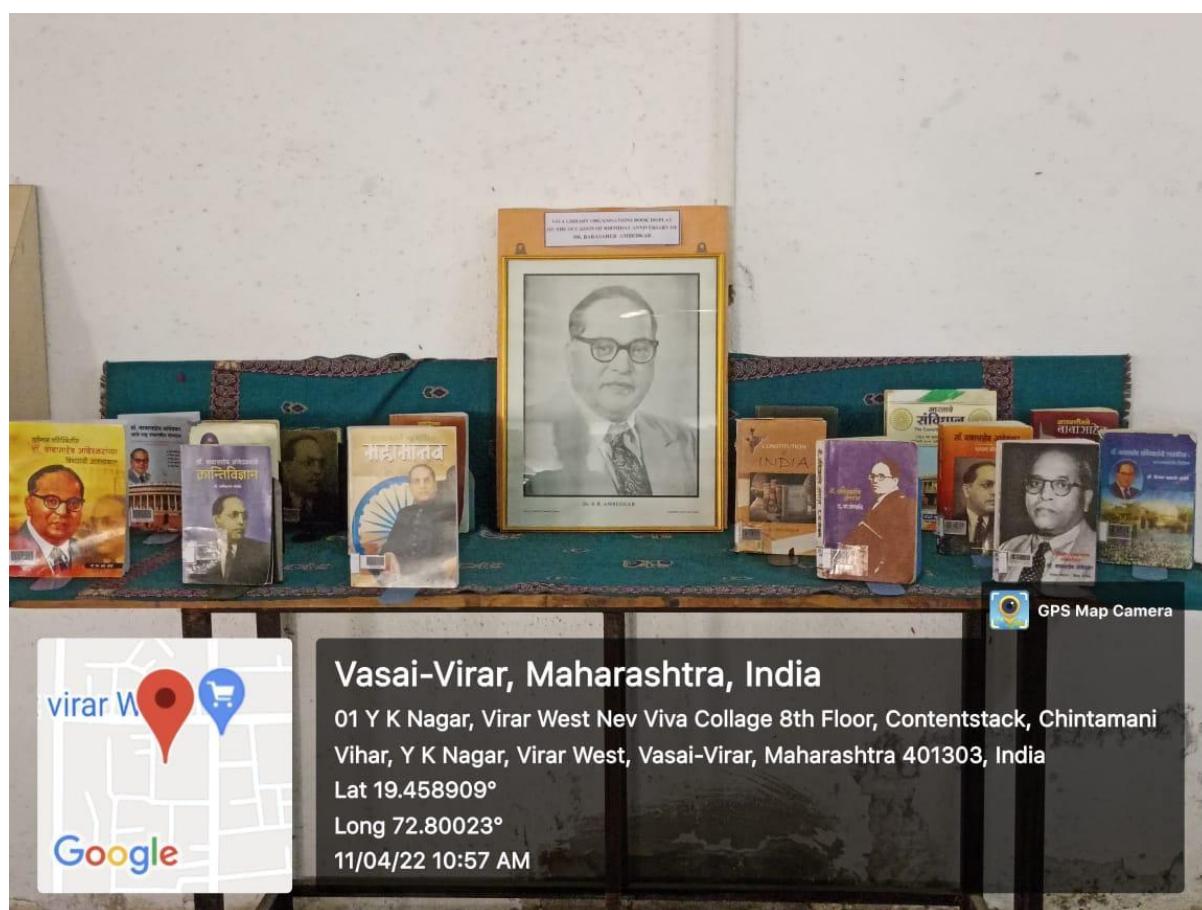

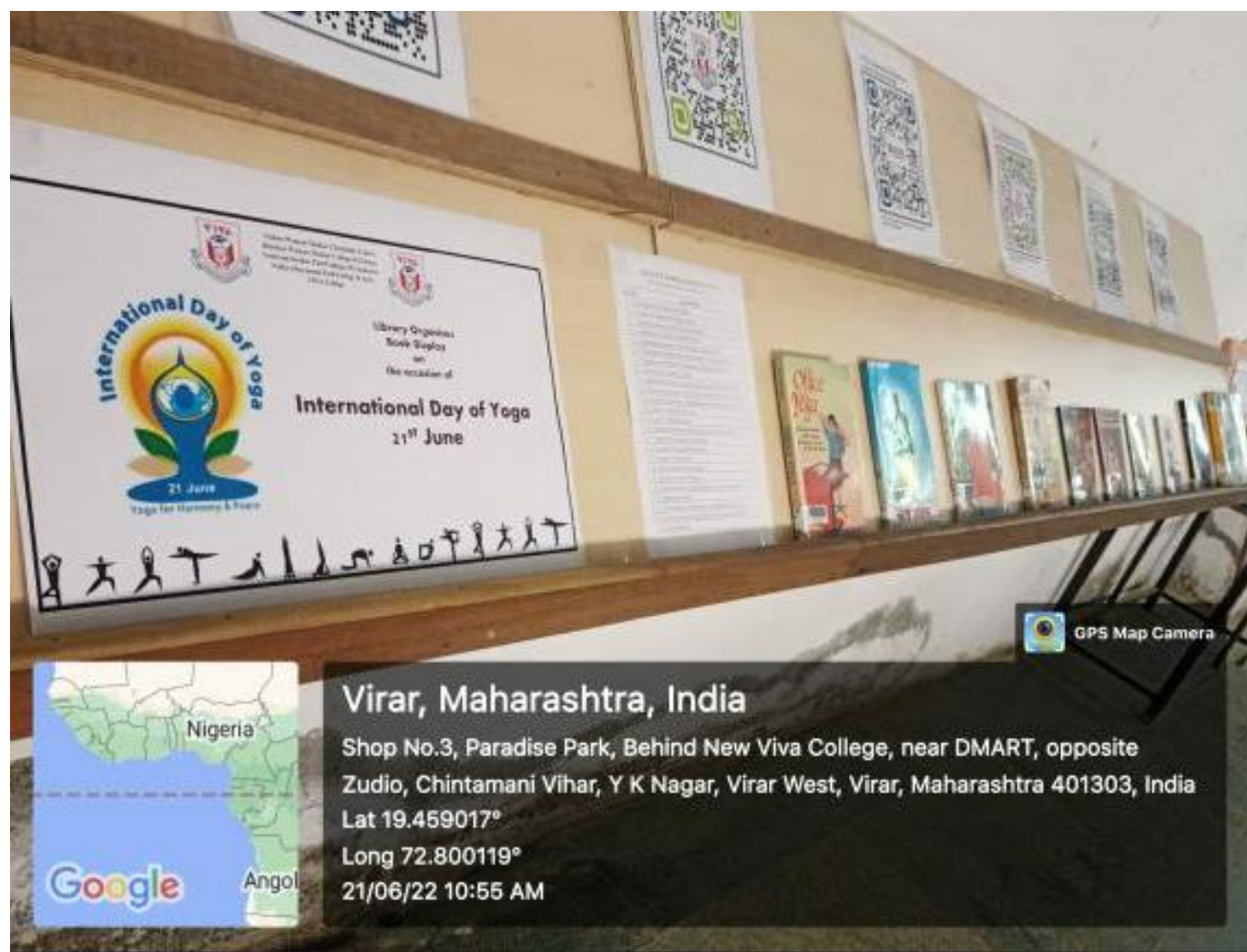
Students, faculty and other staff members visited the Book Display and appreciated the initiative and efforts of Library staff for showcasing the collection of Books.
