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Best Practice 2

Title of the practice:

Outreach programmes with an emphasis on flood relief activities and COVID awareness.

Objective of the practice:

- To inculcate empathy among students.
- 2. To create awareness about what is going on around the globe and how to address such issues.
- 3. To educate the students along these lines and generate a compassionate youth.

Practice:

Our college started this practice in view of the current global concerns such as climate change resulting in floods, and COVID pandemic. The practice included voluntary flood relief work in flood affected areas in Sangli-Kolhapur. The help/donation was collected in the form of 2,000 kg of grain, biscuits, pills, medical supplies, essentials, new clothes and other useful materials. Mask Making Activity was conducted by NSS Cell, University of Mumbai on 2nd May 2020. In the Pandemic situation all Volunteers were informed to make at-least 10 masks each by using their household resources. All the volunteers actively participated in the event and our VIVA NSS UNIT made more than 500 masks.
