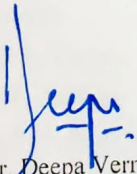

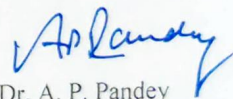

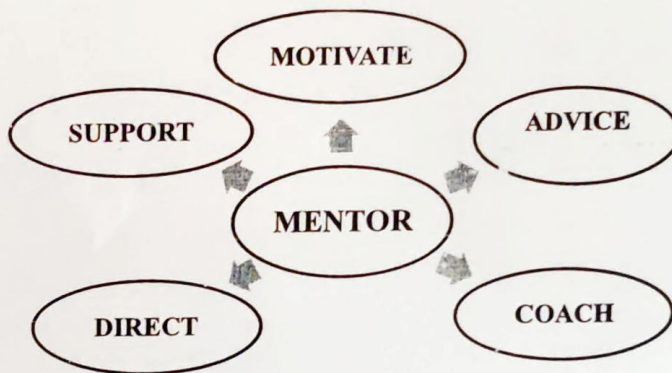
MISSION

WHAT DOES MENTORING MEAN



STUDENT MENTORING POLICY

A uniform traditional policy of student mentoring in the form of Class Teachership was adopted by our institute in the academic year 2019-20. As a student's major interaction & engagement is with their Class Teachers, they are appointed as mentors to help the students overcome their academic & non-academic hurdles.

At the beginning of the academic year, every class was allotted with a class teacher/mentor, after consultation with the faculty coordinators & head of the respective departments. This was done based on the Student-Teacher Ratio of each department, to provide a better understanding of individual students and to bring out their highest potential. Student mentoring is the most effective method for mitigating cases of those students who are vulnerable to stress or are slow learners as well as to cater to the needs of the advanced learners.

AIMS OF STUDENT MENTORING

1. To enhance the teacher-student relationship
2. To enhance students' academic performance and attendance
3. To reduce students' study-related stress/pressures
4. To identify and understand the status of slow learners
5. To encourage advanced learners
6. To render equitable service to all students

BENEFITS OF STUDENT MENTORING

1. Students get academic, professional & personal guidance during the crucial stages of their development.
2. Boosts the students' confidence and morale
3. Encourages students to face challenges and set higher goals
4. Offers psychological support to the students.
5. Helps the students to develop their interpersonal skills.
6. Opens different avenues of academic and professional perspectives for the students.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MENTOR

1. Mentors are expected to offer guidance and counselling, as and when required after collecting all necessary information from the students.
2. Mentors shall meet students both individually or in groups at regular intervals, to keep follow-ups of their progress.
3. In isolated cases, Mentors can call parents of certain students for counselling/special meetings with the in-house counsellor if required.
4. The Mentor has to apprise the concerned subject teacher if a student is identified as having weakness in a particular subject.
5. In case of students belonging to financially backward families, mentors can refer them for the earn & learn program through which the student can study and work part-time in the institute, garnering work experience alongside.

Through this Student Mentoring System, our institution hopes to bring about equitable growth for all students.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE

1. Each mentor will be assigned a group of students based on their departmental Student-Teacher ratio.
2. Mentors will hold a monthly 1-hour mentoring session with their group of students & if need be weekly sessions with individual students.
3. Mentors will collect necessary information of their group of students like attendance records, academic & non-academic performances to understand them better.
4. Mentors will maintain a register to record the grievances of the students, guidance provided & overall performance of the students during these mentoring sessions.
5. Mentors will point out the slow & weak learners to their respective subject teachers and conduct individual sessions for them to help cope up with the others.
6. Mentors will provide academic & non-academic counselling to the students to deal with their curricular, co-curricular, and personal problems.
7. Mentors will keep regular follow up of their students until their issues are resolved.
8. In isolated cases, wherein discrete advice is needed, the Mentors can send the students for professional counselling to our in-house Counsellor, or even call their parents for special meetings.
9. Mentors will also provide regular career guidance based on the student's course outcomes, information on the various postgraduate degrees & diplomas, specialized courses for enhancing the skills of students
10. At the end of each semester/academic session, the mentors will submit a brief report on the status of their student group to the mentoring committee.
